1.7.2 MEDICATION

If you have been administered medication from a medical practitioner that may affect your work you should obtain your doctor's approval and provide your Supervisor with the details of medication and likely side effects. Possible risks to yourself and other workers must be assessed before commencing work.

Plant must not be operated by workers affected by drugs, alcohol or fatigue.

Internal Site Audits—Why?

As a part of our National certification we are required to do periodic audits of sites, actually these are supposed to be at 3 points throughout the duration of projects, 10% 30% & 100% but lets just run with periodically for now :) These internal audits are required to cover Safety, Environmental & Quality, the site inspections carried out over March were mostly really good, bits and pieces here and there however its really important to note that overall your sites are great and getting better all the time and that items raised were promptly rectified, this is all because of your continued commitment.

Some of the checked items may seem silly, lets face it hazardous items in containers not in a banded bin, an out of date item in a first aid box or even one on a fire extinguisher (that hasn't been used) are not likely to kill us, there are much greater risks/hazards around the work you all do every day, in a sense these smaller things combined with the correct use of PPE and paperwork are the door way to our jobs, if anyone walks up and they are not up to scratch the question would be what other safety/envirom measures are we as a company overlooking.

This leads to the next important aspect, the continual improvements in all three areas are a team effort, the Company can't maintain a standard if your not on board and you can't be on board if we are not outlining the required standards, we need each other to achieve success, we need to be a team not you & us.

Always remember that all of this is about the safety of you & your work mates, the safety of the public, the protection on the environment and the quality standard we need to get continued contracts.

If you see something that concerns you speak up, if you are unsure if a task your carrying out is being done in the safest way ask questions of your Supervisor, Rodney, Project Manager, if they are unsure or if legislation governs the task it can be looked into, Risk assessment can be conducted and/or task observations can be included in your SWMS that fall short of covering/providing guidance. At the same time please be patient with us if we ask questions about what your doing to better understand tasks while trying to keep you safe.
