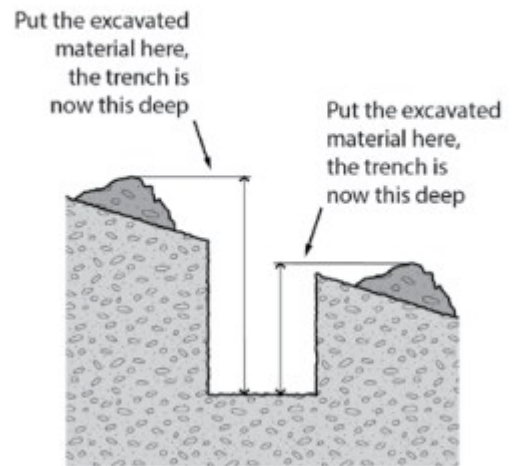
Our Denis has had a bit of a rough month, looks like he will be home next week which is great news, he still has his old mobile number if you want to send him a text or track him down for a visit.

Safety Corner

Note from Excavation work Code of Practice regarding Excavated Material and loads near excavations.. Special attention ..

The depth of trench is determined by the measurement from top of any material on the high side of excavation.

FIGURE 3 Excavated material impact on effective excavation depth



If excavating in sloping ground decide which side of the excavation to place the excavated material. Things to consider include:

- ground conditions
- access to the excavation
- existing underground services
- the need for earthmoving machinery or vehicles to work or move along beside the excavation
- service installation and backfilling requirements, and
- any manual work being undertaken in the excavation.

Placing material on the lower side of the excavation will reduce the effective height of the excavation (see Figure 3) and the risk of material falling or being washed into the excavation.

Aboriginal Heritage Significance

At Morgans, we have a unique opportunity to assist in the recording and protection of significant Aboriginal heritage sites in our local area, the recording of sites gives an historical picture of the original peoples living on this land, the physical evidence of the use and daily life of local Aboriginals and the produce they used in our area is an invaluable part of all of our history.

Places of Aboriginal Heritage Significance are generally identified in the planning stages and as such their location and sensitivities are made known to us, however as we literally 'Turn Earth' every day there may still be occasion for the discovery of items/places unknown

It would be with great pride if our Company were able to contribute to the protection and identification of such places, so please always have your eyes open and report anything, on any project, even if you're not sure... better to be safe than sorry as these sacred places cannot be replaced.

Most commonly found in our area are Shell or Pippi middens, these are historical places where the debris from eating shellfish and other food has accumulated over time, these are of great significance to our Bundjalung peoples and local history- If uncovered or in any doubt contact Management immediately

They can contain:

- ✓ shellfish remains
- ✓ bones of fish, birds, and land and sea mammals used for food
- ✓ charcoal from campfires
- ✓ tools made from stone, shell, and bone
- ✓ Human Remains
